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



A word on liberalism...

What is I.P.?

Copyright monopoly

- Patent monopoly
- Trademarks

I.P. is redundant!

But it gets worse...

... because lawmakers never intended for this!!

Time does tell!

1. **If** copyright et al. are bona fide property

2. Then no sense in time-limiting them

3. But time limits are codified into law!

4. **By the** *contrapositive* we conclude that copyright et al. *are not* as in 1.

So besides redundant...

"Intellectual Property" is misleading!

But then... **how did it get in the picture** in the first place??

State(s) to the rescue!

Actually, we'll come back to this...

Thought experiment...

Consider the copyright monopoly:

- 1. You are (say) a prosperous publisher
- 2. But computers & internet are killing business
- 3. Idea: you will ask for the State's help...

Can you guess what happens?

State(s) to the rescue!

... or not!

Market economy

Sorry, no can do!

Must think harder!

must be judged on their merits!!


